Introduction to gender studies – dr Dominika Polkowska

Course duration: one semester

Number of ECTS credits: 4.0

Course description: This course is intended to provide students with an overview of a number

of major themes underscoring Gender Studies as academic disciplines. We will examine and

discuss a multiplicity of recurring themes affecting the lives of different women and men in a

variety of ways. Topics will include, but are not limited to, the social construction of gender,

work; education; media; the public /private sphere. The course explores the experience of

women regarding changes in women's responsibilities in the family, participation in the labor

force, and the development of new family forms. Illuminates contemporary issues regarding

work, marriage, and family from a historical perspective. We put special attention on women

in science. On the other hand we will discuss about changes in the roles of men, with special

focus on the crisis of masculinity and its consequences to the family, work and the society.

Aims: During the course we hope to discover how adopting a 'gender perspective' challenges

traditional notions of femininity and masculinity. By understanding and examining gender,

femininity and masculinity, students will learn how to think, read, and write in a critical and

creative framework.
