The Polish Language and Culture Centre for Polish People from Abroad and Foreigners offers various forms of education, corresponding to the diverse needs of the participants in terms of the program, its duration and dates of classes

The main forms of education offered by the Centre include:

- ✓ **One-year preparatory course for university studies in Poland**
- ✓ **Postgraduate studies in teaching Polish as a foreign language**
- ✓ **Postgraduate studies in the field of translation studies**
- ✓ **One-year Postgraduate Humanity Studies for Foreigners**
- ✓ **One-year Polish language course**
- ✓ **Summer Courses**
- ✓ **Intensive courses of the Polish language**

In the summer we organise **specialised courses for students of all backgrounds within the so-called "Polonian Summer"** program, where the participants have an opportunity to improve their knowledge of the Polish language and learn more about Polish culture, literature and history.

Foreign students starting their studies on a fee-paying basis can take advantage of a free-of-charge intensive course in the Polish language, organized in September.

All first year foreign students may participate in the **free-of charge one-year language courses** to improve their Polish.

All courses taught by CJKP end with an exam and graduates receive a certificate including the grade, number of class hours, level of advancement and awarded ECTS points. **The curricula are consistent with the European Framework of Reference for Language Competence and examination requirement standards developed by the State Commission for the Certification of Proficiency in Polish as a Foreign Language.** Therefore the graduates may progress to the certification exams, which are also held in Lublin.

Studying at CJKP brings our students multiple benefits. Firstly, they gain **a very good level of knowledge about the Polish language** - classes are taught by experienced teachers, authors of textbooks and members of the examination boards for the Polish language, in a highly suitable building with a library, computer room, and multimedia equipment. Secondly, **our students learn about Polish culture and gain an understanding about contemporary Poland**; in addition to the language lessons we give lectures on culture, literature and history, and we offer a rich cultural and tourist program. Thirdly, they get to **make new friends, become familiar with other cultures and languages, learn tolerance and establish intercultural contacts.** Moreover, they learn self-reliance, responsibility and broaden their horizons, while stimulating their ambitions and realizing their multiple talents.

In addition to the educational program, the Centre offers **a wide range of extra-curricular activities.** Every week there is **a presentation of Polish film** and, at the weekends, **visits to concert halls, theatres and museums.** In the evenings, there are a number of **sporting activities** available. We organize **various cultural events**, such as the evening of song and dance, national evenings, urban games, bilingual recitation contests, evening of legends, theatrical performances by students, Nativity plays, Christmas meetings, Shakespearian competition (in English), barbecue parties, sleigh rides, and the "Beyond the Borders" choir. Periodically we organize Literary Evenings at CJKP, to which we invite leading Polish writers and journalists. In the spring we have trips to Kazimierz Dolny, Sandomierz, Koziółka, Zamość and Kraków. We take good care of all our students in a responsible and caring manner in the many spheres of life to ensure that they get the best out of their time here.
