The course deals with the central problem of regional economics: what drives regional development and what impedes it? During the course different positive and negative factors of regional growth and development are discussed basing on case studies from various regions, including Catalony, Mezzogiorno and the Ruhr Valley.

Quality of life as the ultimate goal of regional policy. OECD Regional Wellbeing Index – a useful tool for comparing quality of life in regions. Internal and external factors of regional development. The strength of regional economy: a special case of Catalony. Innovativeness and human capital as drivers of regional development – Silicon Valley. Within-country disparities in regional development: Silicon Valley and Southern Italy (Mezzogiorno). The importance of social capital. The importance of human capital for local public services: the experiment with 6-hoursworking day in Gothenburg. Sustainable development in regions: the case of Ruhr Valley. Sustainable development and smart cities. Social economy and local development. SMART regional analysis: the example of Lublin.
