Short description	The module covers the knowledge in the area of the services of general interest in the European Union. It presents the review of the fundamental terms and institutions of comparative administrative law, the role of the integrations in the field of administrative law, especially on the role of the European Administrative Space. The course will analyze the different systems of the services of general interest provision. The module develops the ability of comparative analysis of different law systems and distinct legal solutions, mutual relations of the services of the general interest provision and administrative law doctrine.
