### Bios of trainers:

**Veerle Van den Eynden** is Research Advisor Research Data Management within the KU Leuven Research Data Management Competence Centre (RDM-CC). She provides expert guidance and training to researchers on data management, planning and data sharing and with the RDM-CC coordinates the development of practical tools, services and solutions for good data management. She has worked in various roles in research data service provision for 14 years, lead collaborative R&D projects on managing and sharing data and studied researchers' data management and open science practices and motivations for open science.

**Willeke de Haan** is advisor research data management at the KU Leuven research coordination office. She gives training and advises researchers about research data management plan writing, data management,



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FAIR/open data and funder compliance. She has a PhD in biomedical sciences and experience in fundamental research and preclinical trials in metabolic and cardiovascular diseases.

**Claudio Carlone**, Economic and financial studies at the University of Ancona, Italy and Institut Catholique des Hautes Etudes Commerciales (ICHEC) – Brussels, Belgium. Since 1997, as Managing Director of Eurocentro, he has managed and coordinated several national and transnational projects, also in regards to the administrative and financial issues and reporting duties. He has thus long experience in both management, financial, legal and communication aspects of EU projects, and in assisting organisations in project implementation.

**François Boucher** is a Postdoctoral Research Fellow at the Centre for Ethics, Social and Political Philosophy of the Institute of Philosophy at the KU Leuven. He works as part of the Justice and Migration project since the Fall of 2019. He completed his PhD at Queen’s University, Canada, and has been a postdoc at University College London, Université de Montréal and Université Paris 1 Panthéon Sorbonne. François works in the field of contemporary normative political philosophy and applied ethics. Most of his work explore different topics related to liberal theories of justice and the accommodation of ethnocultural diversity. He published on topics such as secularism and religious minorities, minority nationalism and federalism and the rights of indigenous peoples. His publications also deal with the ethics of asylum and migration as well as with federalism and distributive justice. He published articles in international journals such as *Studies in Philosophy and Education*, *Ethical Perspectives*, *Criminal Law and Philosophy*, *Philosophy and Public Issues*, *Comparative Migration Studies* and several book chapters. He is the editor of the political philosophy section of the online *Encyclopédie philosophique*.

**Prof. Tullia Gallina Toschi** has a full honour degree in Chemistry and Pharmaceutical Technologies (Alma Mater Studiorum - University of Bologna). After a PhD in Food Biotechnology, she won the position of researcher, assistant professor and then full professor (2016). She has been the coordinator of two H2020 projects, respectively: OLEUM (“Better solutions to protect olive oil quality and authenticity” 2016-21) and PLOTINA (“Promoting gender balance and inclusion in research, innovation and training”, 2016-20). She was nominated President of Guarantee Committee for Equal Opportunities, Employee Wellbeing and Non-Discrimination at Work of the University of Bologna (2013-2017) and Delegate of the Rector for the Welfare at work (2016-21).



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
