The aim of this training is to give the transversal skills for participants so that they are be equipped to create impactful project communications to policy makers.

Policy briefing documents

This workshop includes input on the structure for policy briefing memos and a method for writing them. The format and length of any policy paper varies but they should all include:

- The mission statement of the paper what to expect
- The background narrative that takes us by the hand and bridges to the policy choice
- The options what is your research pointing to? What decisions do policy makers need to get to.
- What is your ask? What do readers need to appreciate, know or do?
- Follow up what do you want and what's the action?

Presentation skills

Researchers need to be able to pitch their research to decision makers at meetings or conferences. We will give participants individual practice, rehearsal and feedback on their communication skills.

- Vocal techniques to add impact intonation, pauses, speed, word stress
- Speak clearly enunciate sounds and project the voice
- Messages that presenters want their audiences to remember
- How people remember presentations, talks, discussions
- How to respond to different types of questions and comments
- How to control nerves relaxing, breathing, preparation, rehearsal

Andrew Manasseh has over 25 years communications management and training experience in Asia,



the Middle East, Africa and Europe. He gained expertise in managing European Commission funded programmes and the communications skills needed for the EU public sector and Institutions.

Training objectives

The course draws on the challenging role of researchers within the novel Third Mission of the university. Academia is increasingly expected to contribute to green growth and sustainable development, by acting also as a facilitator between industry, government, society at large and environment. The aim of the course is twofold. First it provides a selection of both theoretical concepts and tools to understand the relationship between innovation, knowledge transfer and entrepreneurship. Second, the course seeks to stimulate an "entrepreneurial approach" by focusing on soft skills, teamwork, and crossfertilization among participants with different background and expertise.
