Contemporary challenges, such as health inequalities, ageing of populations (chronic illness and disability), medicalisation (pharmaceuticalisation) of society, lay medical knowledge, doctor-patient relationship, and health policies will constitute the framework for discussion. Students will be expected to work both in groups and individually. The course involves submission of a paper (covering a selected sociomedical problem), which is the basis for getting credit.
