Authors Guidelines

- 1. Length of papers: up to 40,000 characters (without footnotes and bibliography) / 10-20 pages
- 2. Papers (electronic file in .doc or .rtf format) should be sent to ewelinakancik@o2.pl.
- 3. The paper should contain an abstract (up to 500 characters), key words and short bio of the paper's author (including affiliation and ORCID, e-mail address).
- 4. The graphic material (like graphics or photos) should be prepared and sent as separate files in .jpg file format.
- 5. The style of document: font: Times New Roman 12, line spacing 1.5.
- 6. The paper should be divided into several parts (like introduction, main parts and conclusions).
- 7. References should be prepared in the following way:

Discursive and explanatory footnotes should be put on the bottom of each page; bibliographic references given in square brackets in the text, in the following order: author's name, year of publication, page number(s); e.g.: [Street 2003: 45-46].

The paper should contain a bibliography prepared according to the following rules:

- books: Melucci, A. 1996. Challenging Codes: Collective Action in the Information Age, Cambridge University Press, Cambridge.
- works in an anthology, a collection by several authors, with one or more editors and/or compilers: Dahlgren, P. 2001. The Transformation of Democracy? [in:] New Media and Politics, B. Axford, R. Huggins (ed.), SAGE Publications, London.
- papers in scientific journals: Kahn, R. Kellner, D. 2004. New media and internet activism: from the 'Battle of Seattle" to blogging, "New Media & Society", vol.6(1).
- press articles: Stasiński, M. 2008. Blogerka kontra Fidel, "Gazeta Wyborcza" 6-7.12.
- internet sources: Cleaver, H. 1997. The Zapatista Effect: The Internet and the Rise of an Alternative Political Fabric, http://uppingtheanti.org/node/1764 (access 12.1.2009)
- 8. Each chapter must have a separate bibliography
- 9. Finally, information about the author
