

Politics and Society"**, which will be held on June 5-6, 2025 in Lublin at the Faculty of Political Science and Journalism of UMCS (ul. Głęboka 45, 20-612 Lublin).

The geopolitical location of Poland means that issues related to East-Central Europe remain at the centre of interest of researchers and experts. In the scientific and didactic dimensions, this translates into the development of interdisciplinary research and academic studies in the field of humanities and social sciences. The basic goal of the Convention is to create a space for a scientific debate and to integrate the community of researchers dealing with the history, culture, politics and societies of the states of the region.

Dynamic geopolitical changes, challenges and threats to security and sociopolitical transformations in the states of East-Central Europe create a growing need for a reliable, multi-level and multi-dimensional analysis of the ongoing changes and processes and for conducting interdisciplinary research in this area. The complexity and depth of regional and global changes determine the transformation of the international order and processes taking place within states and societies.











The Convention is supposed to be a part of the current scientific and expert discourse. It will offer a space for an exchange of ideas and experiences of researchers dealing with the countries of the region, whose stability and development are of key importance for the security and development of the entire continent.

Proposed thematic areas of the Convention:

- History and historical memory of the nations of East-Central Europe;
- Cultural and linguistic identity of the nations of East-Central Europe;
- Social processes in East-Central Europe in the 20th and 21st centuries;
- Political processes in East-Central Europe in the 20th and 21st centuries;
- Geopolitics and security of the East-Central European states;
- Wars and conflicts in East-Central Europe in the post-Cold War period;
- International relations, integration and disintegration processes in East-Central Europe;
- Eastern European and Slavic studies in the 21st century.
